

When to choose urgent care?

Our McAllen VA Urgent Care Clinic can meet many of your healthcare needs. They are able to provide diagnostic testing, like certain blood and urine tests, and you can often get treated for non-life threatening illnesses or injuries much faster than in a traditional emergency room. Urgent care might be right for you if you have health problems or symptoms like:

- A sore throat or persistent cough
- Strains, sprains, or minor broken bones
- Deep cuts that are no longer bleeding
- Abdominal discomfort
- Allergies
- Mild burns
- Mild nausea or vomiting
- Urinary tract infection symptoms (like needing to pee often or urgently, or urine that looks cloudy or smells bad)

When to head to the Emergency room or dial 911:

- Head injury
- Trouble breathing
- Falling without a known cause
- Cuts that won't stop bleeding
- Stroke symptoms (like slurred speech, sudden numbness or weakness, or a drooping face)
- Chest pain (like pressure, squeezing, or a feeling of fullness in your chest)
- Severe allergic reaction symptoms (like swelling lips or trouble swallowing or breathing)
- Severe dizziness or loosing consciousness (passing out)
- Vomiting or nausea or that won't stop
- Dilated pupils
- Clear fluids draining from your nose or ears

For serious or potentially lifethreatening symptoms, call 911 or access the nearest emergency room. Veterans experiencing thoughts of suicide or self-harm should immediately contact the Veteran Crisis Line at 988 press 1.
